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conditioning occurs when two stimuli are paired with each other.

Usually, one of those stimuli produces a response innately (i.e., without experience). Pavlov called these stimuli unconditioned

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stimuli (USs)

because the response they elicit is not conditional on things other than the US occurring.

A strength of
classical
conditioning theory
is that it is
scientific. This is

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because it's based on empirical evidence carried out by controlled experiments. For example, Pavlov (1902) showed how classical conditioning could be used to make a dog salivate to the sound of a bell.

Classical conditioning is also

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a reductionist explanation of behavior. This is because a complex behavior is broken down into smaller stimulus-response units of behavior.
