Treatment of recurrent temporomandibular joint dislocation with intramuscular botulinum toxin injection Recurrent dislocation of the mandibular condyle poses a difficult problem for affected patients. In the course of time, dislocations often become more frequent and more difficult to avoid.

Treatment of recurrent temporomandibular joint dislocation ...

Repositioning is carried out in two steps. For dislocations that have been present for a longer time, manual repositioning may be ineffective and surgery may be needed. Recurrent dislocation can be treated in a minimally invasive way with botulinum toxin injections or autologous blood therapy. Surgery may be needed if these methods are ineffective.

On the other hand, botulinum toxin injections into the lateral pterygoid muscles offer the option of a predictable and prolonged period without renewed dislocation. We present the results of this treatment carried out in 21 patients with recurrent temporomandibular joint dislocation.

A 2-year-old girl was referred with chief complaints of restricted mouth opening and micrognathia due to bilateral TMJ ankylosis.

TMJ arthroscopy. In some cases, arthroscopic surgery can be as effective for treating various types of TMJ disorders as open-joint surgery. A small thin tube (cannula) is placed into the joint space, an arthroscope is then inserted and small surgical instruments are used for surgery.

Additional drug treatment with short-term, low-dose diazepam for acute myofascial pain, or a neuropathic analgesic such as amitriptyline or gabapentin for chronic pain, may be helpful. Referral to additional services for a dental assessment, cognitive behavioural therapy, or physiotherapy may be helpful, depending on clinical judgement.
